COMMUNITY GARDENS' EVENTS

- Deadline for returning gardeners
 - March 1 every year
- Opening Day
 - \circ $\,$ This Saturday, April 20 $\,$
- Great Day of Gardening
 - Saturday, May 18, 1 4 pm
- All payments due by July 31st
- Closing Day
 - Sunday, October 20
- Lots of events hosted by leadership committees throughout the season

GARDEN INCIDENTS

- Incidents can happen in public spaces, like community gardens
- Report incidents to Garden City Harvest
 - Incident Report Form
- Mitigating Theft and Vandalism Document
- Theft is usually not malicious
- Engage watchful eye
- Educate the broader community and visitors
- Approach someone in the act

GARDEN OPERATIONS

SOIL AND STRAW

- 2 buckets of manure per plot
 - Follow signs at your garden (3 at Mil Trail)
- Add additional amendments by following <u>Our soil best practices</u>
- Use your garden's compost!





- ¹/₂ bale of straw per plot for overwintering crops
- Old straw still good for mulching or compost

WEEDING

- Your plot & pathways = your responsibility
- Springtime = weedtime
- Weed guide in resource binder and on garden orientation pages
- <u>Top weeds in Missoula blog</u>
- Does not count for volunteer hours unless in the greater community garden!
- Pathways included....



PATHWAYS

- Your pathways are your responsibility (details depends on garden site)
- Clear and accessible = human + wheelbarrow
- Irrigation in pathways at some sites
- Plan plot accordingly
- Cut back overgrown plants
- Pull wild sunflowers
- Help us out with weed whacking and mowing!



GARDEN PILES

- Weed and stalk piles
 - What about pesty or diseased plants?
- Compost aka "house compost"
- Straw
- Rocks
- Raspberry stalks and habitat piles



IRRIGATION AND WATERING

Gardeners' responsibility to water

- Most sites share communal hoses
- Always turn off water when done
- Open sprayer nozzle to release pressure

Keep your eye out for leaks and pooling

- Tell staff or call office asap!
- Leave a message on the board & Facebook
 - * River Road and Orchard Gardens gardeners
 - * Milwaukee Trail gardeners
- Watering time and amount will change with the season and as plants grow!



OTHER RANDOM THINGS

- Trash
 - Pack it in, pack it out! (& then some)
- Tools and Hoses
 - Do not take off site
 - If it breaks, alert staff
- Trellising and tomato cages

 Store neatly in your plot or in communal space over winter
- Gates and Sheds
 - Always close and lock
 - Always double check!
- Pets on leash are welcome
 Except on farms



DON'T WASTE, DONATE!

- Produce sharing systems at some gardens
- Free fridges and pantries
- Grow a Row with Missoula Food Bank
- <u>List of Places to Donate Extra Produce</u> document online, in resource binder, and hanging on sheds





OUR TOP CROPS FOR BEGINNING GARDENERS

- Zucchini one plant!
- Tomato look for bush varieties like Glacier or Moskovitch, cherry tomatoes are prolific, but can be crazy.
- Bush beans
- Kale or chard
- Mixed greens
- Radishes
- **Turnips**
- jalapenos, cayenne. Hot peppers
- Potatoes
